- 86% of Registered Voters Vote, the Highest in State History for any Election

 - 18-25 year olds and the Native American Community had much higher voter turnout figures in this election cycle
 - o Turnout in the 37th LD was extremely high
 - o We increased Democratic turnout in every district in the state
 - We did not have access to door knocking and events
 - Direct voter contact is critical
- We have a number of individuals joining the State Legislature
- Tina expresses gratitude for the outstanding work in the 37th Legislative District
- We are waiting for final certified results
- We have redistricting opportunities
 - o It is imperative to ensure that tribal lands are joined (not split)
 - We will maintain our number of Congressional Districts in the next redistricting process
- We believe that there are perhaps 1 million unregistered voters in Washington State and that there is an opportunity to focus efforts in this area

3. State Committee Meeting Incident (7:55 – Alec Stephens)

- The meeting took place during the time of the George Floyd/Black Lives Matter protests
- A stronger and more specific resolution on the event was being discussed at the State Committee Meeting
- The individual in question (not a member of the 37th LD) made a motion to keep the
 original resolution rather than the second a more stronger resolution. She suggested
 that reference to George Floyd should be eliminated and that George Floyd was not
 a good person, unlike the Civil Rights icons

- The room erupted, because many people were outraged by the individual in questions comment
- A motion was made to censure the individual in question. There was much discussion regarding this and other options for proceeding. The censure resolution passed overwhelmingly
- Next, there was another motion to state that individuals who did not vote in favor of the censure resolution are racist
- Justin discussed training opportunities via Erin Jones
- Tina Podlodowski discussed upcoming efforts at the State Level
- Comments and questions from members
