Many individuals in WA have limited access to healthcare. What steps should the legislature take to ensure that all WA residents have meaningful and equitable access to the care and prescriptions they need for their health?

We cannot remain a country where people fear to go to the hospital, where people in crisis beg their friends to call an Uber instead of an ambulance, where divorces happen on deathbeds so that those left behind are not saddled with debt. Soaring healthcare costs are at the foundation of all of our healthcare troubles, and these issues must be addressed at the root. I support a single-payer approach that allows the federal government to bargain for better prices across the board, and allow equitable access to all our citizens. In the meantime, I will advocate for price ceilings on life-saving, cheap-to produce medications like insulin and PrEP.

Even with recent policies like the Clean Fuels Standard, we know that WA state is significantly behind on hitting its carbon pollution goals for 2035. What climate action and environmental justice policies must the WA legislature adopt in order to actually make progress against these goals and address the climate crisis with the urgency needed?

I believe that investments in green energy and infrastructure will not only protect future generations, but will also create jobs and build up our economy. Investing in green technology such as solar panels contributes to a virtuous cycle in which prices drop and adoption expands all over the globe.

However, it is vitally important that people of color and other disadvantaged communities are the first to benefit from these opportunities. This effort will require deep communication between unions, businesses, and the communities that stand to lose the most if we do not move forward thoughtfully and equitably. The Duwamish River Cleanup Coalition is an excellent example of this sort of community-driven movement, making sure that the families on the ground are leading these efforts, rather than being subject to them. I look forward to building a better, greener city in dialogue with everyone who would be affected.

Economies do not prosper when wealth is concentrated in the hands of the few. The fact that Washington has the most regressive tax structure in the nation is a moral scandal, and I would legislate towards a budget that asks less of our working families. A backward state constitution prevents us from adopting many taxes that would allow our state to fulfill its progressive promise, and I look forward to joining to legislative movement to amend this injustice.

As Democrats, we strive to create a more just and equitable world for all, especially including those communities that have been historically marginalized. How will you center equity in the process of developing legislation, particularly that which impacts individuals unlike yourself?

My work as Co-Chair of the DEI Committee has addressed these issues directly, and this experience will inform my work in office. The most important lesson I've learned has been from the practice of designating local leaders within workplaces that can advocate for themselves with the sort of specificity and nuance that only they could provide. As an elected official, I know it will be vitally important to listen to the voices of those I intend to serve. Serving the community means listening to the community.

Housing is a passion of mine - too much of our wages are lost to rent. With fewer and fewer of us able to invest in a permanent home, entire generations lose the ability to build wealth for their families. I see my community being fractured by the predatory effects of gentrification, and I believe no one should have to work multiple jobs out of fear of being evicted. In order to remedy these gaps, I plan to champion policies that would build our capacity of affordable housing, push back against exclusionary zoning, and increase tenant protections for our renters.
