I have worked for Seattle as an assistant city attorney for 12 years, including time in both the criminal and the civil divisions. In the criminal division, the wide and varied duties I handled provided me with valuable firsthand knowledge of how misdemeanor crimes are handled in Seattle. I have evaluated police reports to determine any appropriate misdemeanor charges. I have handled hundreds of cases and tried over 60 jury trials in Seattle Municipal Court. I have also worked with participants in therapeutic courts, including Mental Health Court and Community Court, to efficiently and compassionate address non-violent criminal behavior while improving community livability for all. Currently, I serve in the civil division, advising and defending the City on matters involving a range of issues, including police accountability, homelessness, and neighborhood concerns.

Pro Bono, as an Assistant City Attorney I have to be very careful about Pro Bono work. Outside of providing pro bon legal advise I am an active member of Alpha Kappa Alpha, the first intercollegiate historically African American sorority, dedicated to providing support to the community through education, women's healthcare, and economic empowerment.

I also currently serve as the treasurer of the Dynamic Urban Opportunities Foundation which provides young black women graduating from high school with college scholarships.

What do you believe are the most important qualifications and qualities for justices and judges? What is your experience serving as a judge/justice, pro tem, or within the judicial system and how will this inform your perspective on the bench?

An understanding and awareness of how a criminal case impacts the lives of all those involved is an essential quality for judges. A judge must rule with respect, compassion, equity, and hope. The judge must set the tone in her Courtroom to demonstrate that all will be treated fairly, when you enter my Courtroom we are all equals.

My awareness for how a criminal case impacts all those involved has further deepened since serving regularly as a pro tem judge within King County. In this role, I am responsible for making probable cause determinations, setting pre-trial release conditions, imposing sentencing, and overall applying the law fairly while respecting the humanity of each person involved along the way.

Access to justice and equity means that I provide people with an opportunity. An opportunity to be heard. The legal system is confusing and judges need to take the time to educate on what is happening in their Courtrooms. As a Pro Tem I have seen people grappling to understand the proceedings taking place. I have stopped proceedings to inquire if people understand or if an interpreter is needed after one was declined or even if the individual needs more time to consult with his/her attorney. Also understanding that people have lives and responsibilities outside of Court and try to the extent possible to set hearings that may not require people to take off a full day of work.

I am a lawyer. The privilege is that I have been blessed with parents that have encouraged and pushed me to obtain the education necessary to progress in my life. As an immigrant, I have to remind myself that everyone does not get the same opportunities. That's why in my Courtroom I want to instill that we are all equals, no matter your background, education, or socio-economic status.

Treating all people the same when they enter my Courtroom, that's how I start. People of color do not want to be othered what they want is to be treated equitably. Judges are required to review the facts and merits of each case that come before them, a focus on facts not race, gender, or socio-economic status. A human centered approach. There are multiple alternatives to incarceration that can be considered such as court funded electronic home monitoring or once a week check in with probation. Also COVID-19 has forced the Court to use technology more than ever so I can envision implementing and continuing Zoom check-ins with the Court and probation. Depending on the case and the circumstance I may also be willing to apply a clean slate for all those that come before me and not focus so heavily on their prior failure to appear history.
