What do you believe are the most important qualifications and qualities for justices and judges? What is your experience serving as a judge/justice, pro tem, or within the judicial system and how will this inform your perspective on the bench?

I believe patience, empathy, humility, kindness, and willingness to learn are the most important qualities for a justice or judge. A judge must realize that she should consider all factors when analyzing a case, including systemic racism and sexism, and be willing to learn from the attorneys before her. Everyone is human, and everyone deserves to be treated with dignity and respect.

I served as a Municipal Court Judge in Federal Way for 12 years after winning a 6-person contested election. Prior to that I served as a Judge Pro Tem for 2 years in various jurisdictions around King County. I learned that kindness and patience is essential for a judge, and that the most important qualifications for judges is the ability to see each person before them as an individual, with a lifetime of experiences that have led them to this point. With that knowledge, a judge should treat everyone with dignity, respect, and understanding.

How would you further equity and access to justice for all in the legal system? Provide specific examples of what you have done or commit to doing to further this goal.

I believe it is essential that judges not only treat everyone with equity but advocate for that outside of court as well. Judges have an important voice in the racial and social justice movements, and we should use that voice. I would continue to advocate for equity and justice through my work on statewide and local boards, write or support legislation which addresses these issues, and will testify before the County Council or Legislature on bills that address these issues – all within the restrictions of the Code of Judicial Conduct.

Judges are expected to fairly apply the law and perform all duties without bias or prejudice. Please provide examples when you have realized and self-checked your own privilege and/or bias or encouraged others to point out to you your own implicit biases?

Everyone has biases, and the most important thing to realize is that you do, and that you can recognize it and counteract that bias. I see examples every day of my privilege, both economically and as a cis-gendered white person. I try to understand in every instance how someone's background or lack of privilege has informed their behavior. I used to be surprised that people had no respect for the system and did not respect a judge's orders. However, I came to learn that the system had never treated them with respect, and thus had no credibility in their eyes. I have encouraged public defenders to tell me how I could do better in interacting with their clients and sought out advice from the BIPOC community on how best to do so as well.

Q63

How would you address the disproportionate impact of sentencing, punishment, and incarceration in the criminal legal system on Black, Indigenous, and Communities of Color, marginalized, and other vulnerable communities and how would you work to address it? Please provide specific examples (alternatives to incarceration, bail reform, etc.)

First, I recognize that it exists and that there are many factors that contribute to this disproportionality. Only some of those factors are within my ability to control or influence, so a simple understanding of history is critical. Secondly, I would look at each individual and the totality of their circumstances to determine what is appropriate in their case. People should be held accountable for their actions, but a judge should be looking at the whole person, not just their one act. And thirdly, I have advocated for, created, and used jail alternatives throughout my twelve-year career on the bench, including Electronic Home Monitoring, Day Reporting, and Community Services, allowing people to keep their jobs and stay in treatment and not continue the cycle of incarceration.
