Notes from the November, 2023 King County Monthly Meeting (Mary Scanlon)

The meeting was highlighted by a 2024 General Election Report from State Chair Shasti Conrad. Chair Conrad had a lot of good news statewide, including:

SPOKANE ELECTION

State party had received a grant from the DNC and use it to put a lot of resources into the Spokane mayor & city council races.

Spokane went for Biden in the presidential election, but until this election had been under Republican leadership for many years.

Democrat Lisa Brown, who had been the state senate majority leader, won the race for mayor with 51.8% of the votes for mayor, compared to incumbent Nadine Woodward, who earned 47.7% of the votes.

Betsy Wilkerson was elected as Spokane city council president with 53.1% of the vote, making her the first black woman to serve in this capacity.

Liberals maintained control of the Spokane city council.

CITY OF SUNNYSIDE (OUTSIDE YAKIMA)

70% Latino

City Council had not been diverse previously. The 3 incumbents were all white men who had won by less than 100 votes. But in 2023 two Latino candidates ran and won!

STATEWIDE: SCHOOL BOARD RACES

MOMS FOR LIBERTY

Moms for Liberty, a national right-wing advocacy group, started in Florida as a response to Covid-19 school closures and mask mandates. It became just as well known for pushing anti-L.G.B.T.Q policies.

Only 9 of 68 candidates endorsed by that group won.

Less than 20% of their endorsed candidates won nationally.

SNOHOMISH COUNTY

Incumbent County Sheriff Adam Fortney, white supremacist cop, was defeated by Susanna Johnson, a 3decade veteran of the sheriff's office. Chair Conrad specially noted Ann Udaloy's of the 1st LD for her efforts in this race.

WHATCOM COUNTY

Elected its first Black sheriff, Chief Donnell "Tank" Tanksley.

That area will have 2024 legislative priorities: 42nd LD protect state senate seat 10th LD: hope to flip the state senate seat

KING COUNTY

State lawmakers are preparing to push for moving city and school board races to even years, to increase turnout.

Data shows that when turnout is greater, more progressives win.

The projection is that 80-90% of people will vote in 2024.
