7:10 pm 2024 State Legislative Session Recap Senator Rebecca Saldaña

- Short session; was going through chemotherapy while in session.
- Had over 6000 emails from constituents and another 3000 from across the state.
- Wrote about housing stability, environmental issues, and housing in general.
- Got the closest they've ever gotten to getting rent stabilization through the senate. Believes it will get through the session next year.
- Were able to get four of the bills she sponsored to the governor. One about getting Uber and Lyft drivers that provides death benefit in case of death of a driver. Another about making sure all families have access to paid sick days. Bill to extend work protections to those working in adult entertainment industry. Worked on protecting forest and sustainable agriculture.
- Got \$3 million in senate budget, which was matched by the house, to finish Garfield Project.

Representative Sharon Tomiko Santos

- Was her 26th legislative session.
- Have a democratic majority in the house and senate.
- Bills that passed related to creating efficiencies in the Working Family Tax Credit, only requiring college degrees for jobs that really need them, and asking the licensing bodies to reconsider whether citizenship should be required for certain licenses.
- Residents will be getting a newsletter that details policy wins in education.
- Expressed her concerns about the new Washington Saves program
- International Chinatown District was named last year on America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places, was first time any place in the state had ended up on the list. Created preservation society that is just now getting permanent funding.

Representative Chipalo Street

- Capital Gains, Climate Commitment Act, and Long-Term care were sent back to the ballots for citizens to vote on.
- Small wins for housing like tax breaks for long-term housing providers.
- Keep Our Care Act was not passed. Premise of the bill is when healthcare providers merge they go through an AG review to ensure healthcare services in that area are maintained.
