Port Commissioner Toshiko Hasegawa introduced the <u>Protect Maritime Industrial Lands Resolution</u>. After some debate it was moved that we postpone action on this resolution. That motion was defeated 42 to 4: 68 people in attendance with 56 marked as PCOs or members. Then the resolution passed 41 to 2: with 65 people attending and 58 marked as voters.

The <u>Back from the Brink and Washington Against Nuclear Weapons</u> resolution as amended by the Executive Board (dropping the last 2 "therefore"s) was introduced, debated, and passed 39 to 1: 58 people present 54 marked as voters.

The resolution Oppose Seattle-Tacoma International Airport Sustainable Airport Master Plan and Environmental Assessment was moved, seconded, and passed 19 to 10: 47 people attending, 44 marked as eligible to vote.

Vania Adasme was nominated for King County Representative and elected by acclamation.

Meredith Means was nominated for Secretary and elected by acclamation.

Bob Rosenberger and Mary Williams reported that the Washington State Democratic Party Central Committee met and elected officers. Mary Williams made a comment that the State Committee needs to figure out a way to be more inclusive and do a better job of explaining all the processes.

Jamie Fackler reported the King County Central Committee met and discussed plans for the future. The county will be developing the candidate questionnaire later this year.
